By adopting a continuum of care approach, we are better prepared to offer the treatment programs our clients need as they seek recovery from drug and alcohol addiction.

That is why we expanded our physical footprint this past fall into the Firestone Park Outpatient and Aftercare Facility. Besides providing a space for clients to access counseling and support services, this new facility includes a computer lab, drop-in center, and access to peer support.

As we look towards the year ahead, IBH Addiction Recovery will continue to work to eliminate the stigma of addiction and improve upon the programs and services we provide. We will also expand our reach into the community to ensure hope and healing is available to all who strive to recover from drug and alcohol addiction.

Recovery Finds a New Home

Since established in 2020, Outpatient Programs have been operating on the IBH Addiction Recovery residential campus near the Portage Lakes. Since November 2021, Outpatient Programs have a new home in Firestone Park. “Outpatient Programs allow IBH Addiction Recovery residential clients to continue aftercare treatment with professionals they already know and trust once they graduate from our [residential] program,” explains Outpatient Clinical Director Laura M. Kidd, LPCC-S, LICDC-CS. It also allows new clients to enter IBH Addiction Recovery at virtually any point of the recovery process based on their individual needs.”



The IBH REACH Program, launched in 2014, provides organized post-treatment activities that foster safe friendships, reinforcement of values learned during treatment, a strong sense of community, and increased self-esteem. REACH stands for Recovery, Education, Accountability, Community, and Hope.

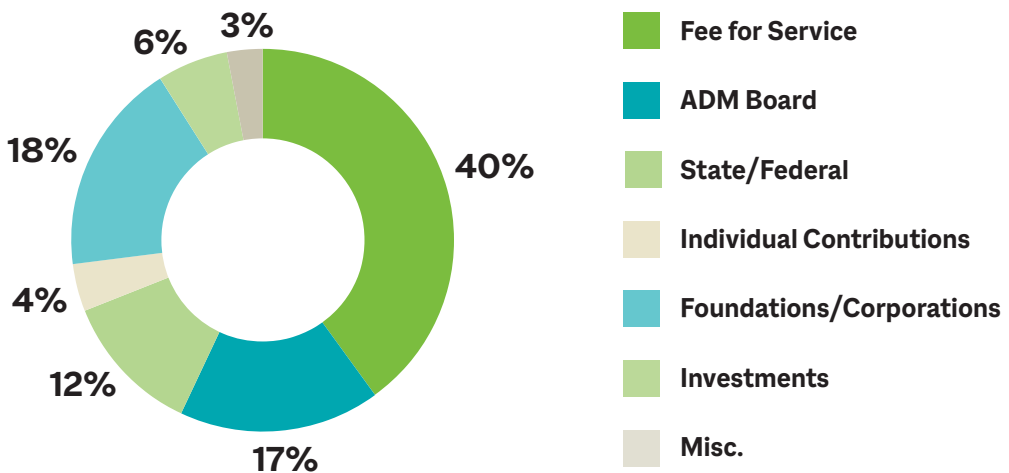
